ENQUIRIES, REGISTRATION & ENTRY

ENQUIRIES

The School Office is responsible for all admissions enquiries, registration and entry procedures.

ETHOS

Rockport aims to find the best in every child, offering a rounded and supportive educational framework which is high in expectations but also demands that traditional standards like good manners and appearance are met. We employ modern technology, best teaching practice, and a strong pastoral team that guides and supports the child, enabling them to gain the confidence required to navigate through their lives. We encourage acceptance and embrace diversity. As a member of the Round Square organisation, we are an international community based on core values that aims to create happy, caring, and tolerant individuals. Our students have a keen sense of responsibility and service - both to their fellow citizens and to the environment.

VISITS

Prospective pupils and their families are encouraged to visit the school as early as possible; we believe that this is the only way to fully appreciate the lovely grounds and excellent facilities, but also to understand the very happy and fulfilling all-round education provided at Rockport.

A personal visit can be arranged with the School Office. Taster Days are available for prospective pupils with no obligation to register.

We also hold a number of Open Days throughout the school year. Please see the school website for details.

ENTRY PROCEDURE

Rockport is a selective school and admission is based upon academic merit, however our selection process is designed to identify pupils who are able to benefit from our balanced and well-rounded education and to make a positive contribution towards the life of the school, rather than by narrow entrance exams alone.

Visit

All prospective pupils and their families are expected to visit Rockport prior to registration; this may be during one of the school's Open Days, or preferably by arranging – through the School Office – a personal visit.

Registration

A Registration Form accompanies the Prospectus and this should be completed and returned to the School Office, along with a registration fee of £250 UK (£500 for pupils from outside the

UK). This reserves a provisional place for your child and enters your details on our database. You will then receive termly updates on events such as concerts, open days, plays, school matches and curriculum development. This will enable us to keep open channels of communication.

Confirmation

Confirmation forms will be issued to all registered families at the appropriate time in the year prior to admission. This will guarantee your child a place, subject to satisfying the relevant entrance requirements.

Meeting with the Headmaster

Prospective pupils will be invited to come to Rockport to meet with the headmaster and the nature of the meeting will be:

Method of Entry

The purpose of these meetings is to ensure that we have an outline understanding of each pupil's relative academic strengths and weaknesses.

'Taster Day'

Those prospective pupils who have not already spent time at Rockport as part of the enrolment process will be invited to spend a day in school with their prospective year group. Boarders are invited to stay overnight.

References

A reference from a prospective pupil's current school will be requested at the time of application.

Acceptance

Once a place has been formally offered, families are asked to complete an Acceptance Form, parent contract, and forward a £500 deposit (£2,000 for pupils from outside the UK). This deposit is refundable on completion of the child's education at Rockport.

SIBLING POLICY

Most siblings join us at Rockport and we believe that this enhances the family atmosphere of the school. However, admission is not automatic, and there may be occasions when we will judge that a sibling is likely to thrive better in a different environment.

There is an automatic discount of 10% remission of fees for the second child, 20% for the third child and 30% for the fourth child.

EQUAL TREATMENT

Our aim is to encourage applications from candidates with as diverse a range of backgrounds as possible – ethnic, social and religious. Rockport is a truly non-denominational school. This enriches the school community and is vital in preparing our pupils for today's world. Generous bursaries and scholarships are offered in order to make it possible for as many as possible to attend the school.

SPECIAL NEEDS

Rockport welcomes pupils with special educational requirements, providing that our Learning Support Department can offer them the support required.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- Fees are payable in advance by monthly Direct Debit.
- One term's notice is required before removal of a pupil or one term's fees in lieu thereof.
- Pupils entering post-primary (Year 8) are contracted for a minimum attendance of two years.
- The school reserves the right to apply fee increases from time to time (with notice).
- Parents are required to notify the school if their children have been in contact with any infectious diseases.
- As a fully independent establishment, the school has complete discretion over the admission of pupils; the Headmaster's decision will be final in this regard.

SCHOLARSHIPS, BURSARIES & FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

SCHOLARSHIPS

Any great school should nurture academic performance through encouragement of scholarship and scholarly example. At Rockport there are a number of awards to encourage excellence and a will to lead from the front through attaining the highest standards.

Scholars and Award holders are expected to lead by example and their performance is reviewed each term.

Academic

Academic Scholarships will be advertised both internally and externally. Those who show outstanding academic performance will be considered for scholarship.

All Scholarship candidates will be interviewed individually.

BURSARIES

Means-tested Bursaries exist for the purpose of ensuring that all talented applicants are able to be considered for entry to Rockport including those whose parents might need financial assistance to meet the fees. Scholarships may be topped up by a Bursary to a maximum of 100% of tuition fees.

H.M. Forces

Rockport has a proud reputation of educating the children of the country's Armed Services. Bursaries offer significant discounts to the fees; please contact the Bursar for further details.

BOARDING

Boarding at Rockport sits in every sense at the centre of School life.

Our Boarding House is located on the first and second floors of the main school building, with our Health Centre and 'Home' room adjacent to the pupils' rooms and recreational spaces. The House is staffed by a Houseparent and House Tutors; however, all students take responsibility for the happiness and well-being of their peers. The House is open to full-time, part-time, weekend and flexi-boarders. The House is also mixed in gender, with a number of pupils coming from an International background. Our student ages range from 7 to 18. This creates a climate that is busy, interesting and balanced between work and play.

Rockport has been a boarding school since 1906 and it has witnessed a number of changes and refinements over a hundred years. What has not changed is its commitment to excellent pastoral care and the desire to provide students with a 'home from home'. Further to this, boarding in Rockport strives to develop in our students those personal attributes that are so essential to their future success. We maintain excellent links with our colleagues in the other Northern Ireland Boarding schools in terms of policy and practice, and Rockport is very much at the forefront of boarding development in Northern Ireland.

Rockport is also conscious that parents of boarders require support and regular contact in respect of their child's progress. This is why we also pride ourselves on our ability to keep parents up-to-date and involved in the workings and events of boarding, through the school newsletter and regular phone and e-mail contact. All parents and pupils are also provided with induction material at the start of each new term. Regular communication between pupils and parents is encouraged and facilitated by easy access to telephone and email.

In all, boarding seeks to provide its students with a happy, industrious and understanding atmosphere. It is this welcoming but also tailored approach that marks us out as unique and caters for the individual needs of each child.

ACADEMIC MATTERS

CURRICULUM

Rockport aims to provide a broad, challenging and stimulating range of academic subjects for study at all levels.

PREP

Prep (homework) is an integral part of a Rockport pupil's learning. Each pupil in R5-12 has a prep timetable indicating which prep is to be done each evening. The amount of prep set varies according to year group. In R8 & R9 there will be two or three 30 minute preps and in R9 to R12 there will often be three 45 minute preps. For those in R11 and R12 there will also be coursework deadlines to meet.

DIARIES & GOOGLE CLASSROOM

Every pupil from R5-R7 is issued with a Prep Diary at the start of each school year. This Prep Diary contains much useful information, as well as providing a mechanism to help pupils organise themselves. It is regularly checked by the pupil's Form Teacher or Tutor. We encourage parents to work with their son or daughter to help them with their academic progress and pupils should use their Prep Diary to record their prep and to use it as a daily diary.

Pupils from R8-R14 are assigned to classes on Google Classroom where all homework and class resources, including teaching notes and revision guides, are posted by their teachers.

REPORTS & PARENT-TEACHER INTERVIEWS

Each pupil's development is very much a partnership between school and home. Rockport aims to ensure that all parents are kept fully informed of their child's progress; this is carried out principally through the following forms of feedback:

STANDARDISED TESTING

NFER Testing: All Junior School pupils sit NFER English and Maths tests annually.

CAT Testing: All pupils sit a Cognitive Ability Test in R8 and R10.

COMMENDATIONS

The small size of the school enables pupils who have performed well academically to be commended by the Headmaster in ordinary Assemblies.

COLOURS

School Colours are awarded annually to pupils who excel academically, in sport or in the performing arts.

SCHOOL PRIZES

School Prizes are awarded on Speech Day at the end of the academic year. They cover not only subject prizes but also recognise wider contributions to school life.

LEARNING SUPPORT

Pupils identified with SpLD (such as Dyslexia), ESL or needing learning support in classwork or GCSE study skills, are provided with 1:1 individual tuition in 'The Cottage' with qualified specialist teachers. Cottage staff work closely with teaching and boarding staff, parents and outside agencies, monitoring and reviewing the child's progress with individual pupil profiles. Pupils are withdrawn from class during the school day with minimum disruption to their normal school timetable. We encourage pupils to use their strengths to overcome their difficulties and to develop their full potential as happy, confident and independent learners.

LEAVING ROCKPORT

We aim to send our pupils to the very best schools when the time comes for them to leave us. We work closely with each family to ensure that the most suitable university for their child is identified and that pupils are properly prepared for entrance assessments and interviews.

18+

The vast majority of those leaving Sixth Form will proceed into Higher Education, at universities and colleges throughout the United Kingdom. They are given individual guidance on choosing the right courses and institutions, and particularly in completing their UCAS admission form. Guidance is also given to Sixth Formers applying to study in the Republic of Ireland and overseas.

13+

Pupils moving to other independent senior schools (boarding and day) will be required to sit the ISEB Common Entrance examination. Papers are taken in a number of subjects (the number and range of these may vary according to the chosen prospective school) but they are rigorous and require careful preparation. Pupils entered for Common Entrance will have additional lessons to ensure that they are ready for these important examinations. Parents are required to give the school at least one year's notice of their intention for their child to be entered.

Boys who wish to move to Eton, Harrow, Winchester or Radley will need to have started this process during R6.

Post-Primary Transfer Test

R7 pupils wishing to move to a local Grammar School post-primary may be entered for the Transfer Assessments; this is done on parental request and on the advice of the pupil's R6 teacher.

OLD ROCKPORTIANS

All leavers are eligible to join the Old Rockportian Club (ORC) which exists to allow members to keep in contact with one another and the school. Various social and sporting events take place annually and a newsletter assists this process.

SPORT

Sport is integral to the life of everyone at Rockport and Games (which encompasses the Physical Education programme) take place for each pupil every afternoon.

MUSIC

Music at Rockport aims to create a generation of children who develop a life-long love of the arts and a sense of 'can do' in a subject where success knows no boundaries.
